Introduction

Honorary Degree Nomination Process – Euro Asian University

The Honorary Doctoral Degree is one of the highest honors awarded by Euro Asian University, recognizing individuals with outstanding contributions in academia, professional achievement, or public service –especially at the international level.

Eligibility & Purpose

The degree honors exceptional merit and achievement in scholarly, professional, or community fields. It reflects the university's commitment to excellence and impact.

Nomination & Review Process

Nominations are received year-round by the International Programs Division. However, to be considered for a specific graduation ceremony, nominations must be submitted in advance.

The review process is confidential and anonymous. Names of nominators are redacted before review by the Director of International Programs, the Academic Chair, and the University President or Honorary Awards Committee.

Every effort is made to ensure diversity across gender, race, age, ability, and representation from all parts of the university's scholarly community.

Approval & Timeline

The Committee compiles and reviews nominations throughout the year and submits a final list of recommended candidates for approval. Graduation ceremony dates are confirmed accordingly.

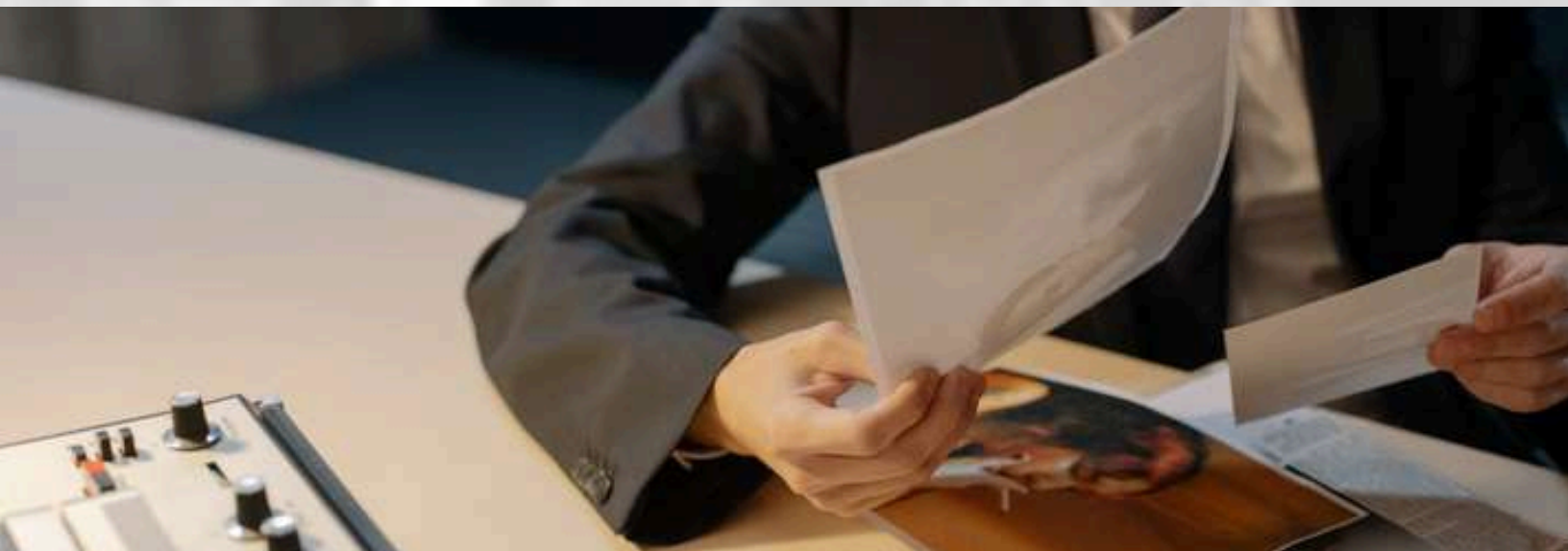

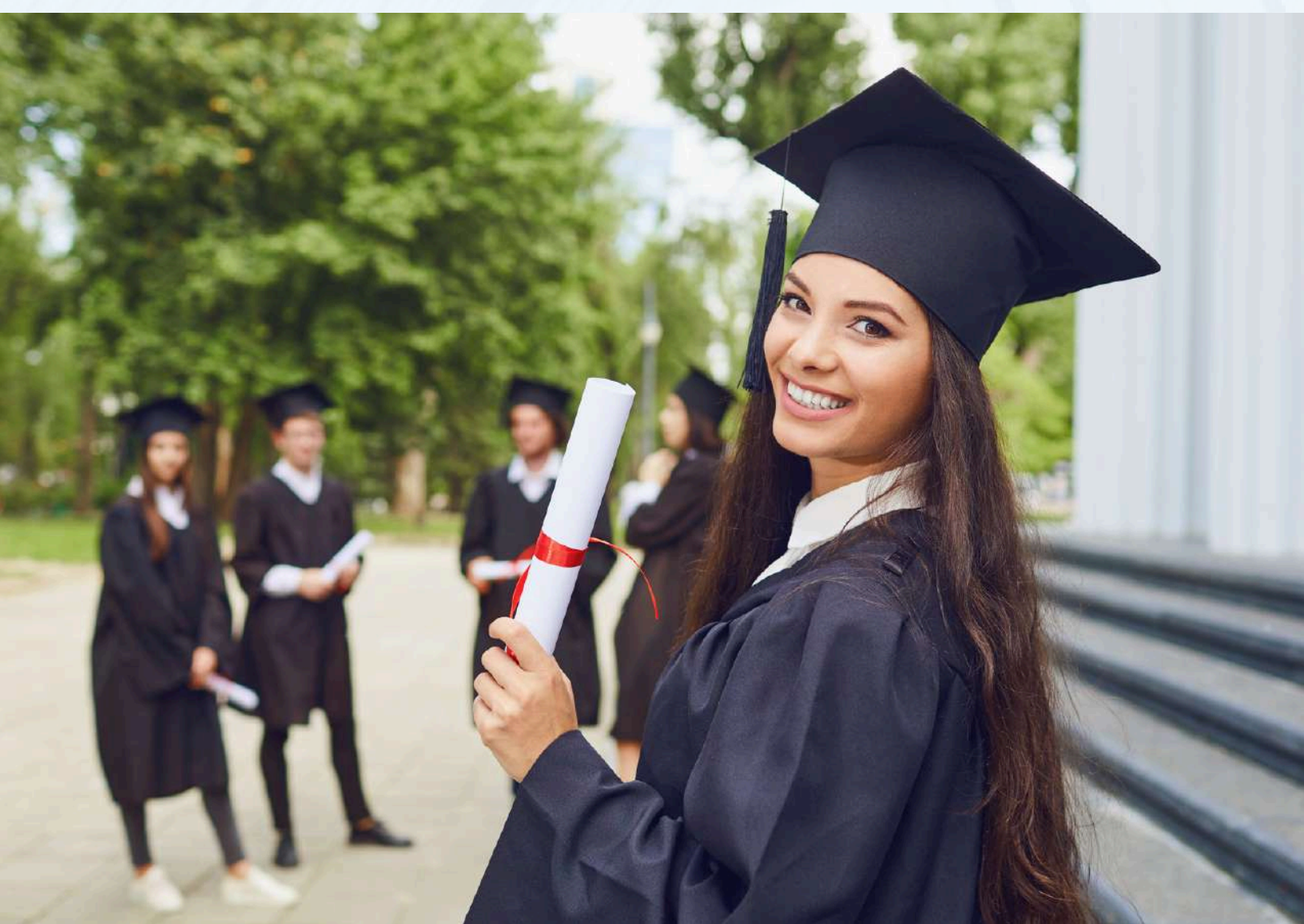

Acceptance Criteria

1

Eligibility 1-

Candidates must possess notable stature and public recognition, such that conferring an honorary doctorate upon them enhances the prestige and global reputation of Euro Asian University.



2

Eligibility 2-

Nominees should exemplify the ethical values, leadership principles, and global vision that align with the mission and educational philosophy of Euro Asian University.



3

Eligibility 3-

Preference will be given to individuals who have demonstrated distinguished achievements in academia, industry, entrepreneurship, public service, or innovation—especially in areas that reflect the university's commitment to global impact, sustainability, and leadership.



4

Eligibility 4-

Candidates should have a reasonable likelihood of formally accepting the honorary award and, where possible, participating in a future convocation ceremony or leadership forum hosted by Euro Asian University.





Nomination Consideration

1. The Honorary Awards Committee of Euro Asian University carefully evaluates each nomination against the following guiding principles:
2. Does the nominee demonstrate truly exceptional achievement with lasting impact on their field, community, or the world at large?
3. Has the individual made transformative contributions to scholarship, global society, culture, innovation, or leadership?
4. Will the nominee's life journey and accomplishments serve as a source of inspiration for our graduating students?
5. Has the candidate been recognized by prestigious honors, fellowships, or awards that reflect their excellence?
6. Is the nominee held in high esteem within their academic discipline or professional domain?
7. Is the timing and context appropriate for Euro Asian University to bestow this recognition now?
8. Is the individual familiar with Euro Asian University's mission, and likely to appreciate the value and honor of this distinction?
9. Does this nomination advance Euro Asian University's commitment to international diversity, academic breadth, and the celebration of global excellence?

Exceptions

Euro Asian University does not ordinarily confer honorary degrees under the following circumstances: posthumously; in absentia; to currently serving political figures; to individuals whose sole connection to the university is financial contribution; or to current members of its faculty, staff, student body, or governing board (eligibility may be reconsidered after three years of concluding active service). Self-nominations and nominations of immediate family members are not accepted.

Nomination Package for Registration

Checklist of information to be included in a complete nomination package:

- **Nomination Letter**
 - Submitted by an Approved Center or Authorized Representative.
- **Academic Qualifications (if applicable)**
 - Degrees, diplomas, certificates issued by accredited institutions.
- **Academic Transcripts or Diploma Supplement (if available)**
 - Official records from postsecondary studies.
- **Resume / Curriculum Vitae (CV)**
 - Up-to-date and includes career achievements.
- **Passport Copy (Color)**
 - Clear and valid copy of the nominee's passport.
- **Passport-Sized Photograph**
 - Formal attire recommended (high-resolution image).
- **Biographical Summary (Max 250 words)**
 - A brief narrative highlighting key career achievements, recognition, and any association with Euro Asian University or global communities.
- **Administrative Review Fee**
 - Covers registration, eligibility verification, and portfolio review. (Note: This is neither a tuition fee nor a donation.)

Nomination Letter

The Nomination Letter is the most critical element for the committee's consideration of a candidate for an honorary degree at Euro Asian University. It must detail the nominee's significant achievements and why they qualify for such an honor, highlighting their contributions at the community, national, or international levels. The letter should emphasize the nominee's distinguished professional accomplishments, including publications, research, or creative work, and their previous awards and recognition. It should also explain why the nominee's work aligns with Euro Asian University's values and mission, reflecting excellence and global impact in their field.
